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
Sunshine, ice cream and memories abound!

AC INSTALLATION



Please have your AC unit installed by a certified contractor to ensure it is safely installed. All units must be installed in a window that has a balcony underneath. For those units without a balcony, portable ACs are a safe alternative. Once running, be mindful of your downstairs' neighbours by making sure water is not dropping on to the apartments below.
